The sessions will be presented by experts from around the country on the following offender accountability models:

- [High Point Model](#), NC, an evidence-based deterrence approach for law enforcement.
- [Ontario Domestic Risk Assessment](#) (ODARA), a law enforcement tool to predict future intimate partner violence, as well as its frequency and severity
- [Colorado Domestic Violence Offender Management Board](#) differential treatment model, using risk assessment in case management by probation and parole

For 40 years, the Pennsylvania Coalition Against Domestic Violence has worked with allies across Pennsylvania to implement policies and procedures to respond to domestic violence and ensure victim safety.

Through Office of Victim Advocate, not only are victims' rights secured, but offenders in the state probation and parole and corrections systems are held accountable for the crimes they have committed.
