At the Pennsylvania Coalition Against Domestic Violence, including our 60 community-based member programs, our dream _ no, our goal _ is to end domestic violence for the next generation. To do that, it's going to take a cultural movement. And men must play a leading role in that movement, because men are overwhelmingly the perpetrators of domestic violence and

sexual assaults, including those against other men. So, it should come as no surprise that PCADV and our domestic violence member programs are devoting more time and resources into engaging men.

last year, we held a symposium and participated in another in Pittsburgh aimed at getting men involved. Both attracted capacity crowds, and both successfully recruited men who are now taking leadership roles in their communities in educating young men about healthy masculinity

Also last year, PCADV partnered with FISA Foundation, The Heinz Endowments and the Pittsburgh Pirates for a special Father's Day celebration in Pittsburgh. It included a full-page advertisement in the Pittsburgh Post-Gazette, in which four-dozen business, political and religious leaders - as well as Pirates Manager Clint Hurdle - signed a pledge to help end gender violence. The ad invited all men to join the cause by signing a similar pledge on the pasaysnomore.com website. The pleage is still available for anyone who wishes to sign.

The Father's Day campaign was so successful, that PCADV and its partners are expanding it this year to include both the Pirates and their cross-state ruals, the Philadelphia Phillies, as well as the Harrisburg Senators, the Class AA affiliate of the Washington Nationals. In addition to Father's Day Pledge celebrations at their respective ballparks, the teams have agreed to feature their players in public service announcements during baseball games. The spots will be similar to the NO MORE ads that appeared during NFL games last fall.

PCADVs ultimate goal is to forge similar partnerships with other sports organizations in the commonwealth and develop a statewide network of waches, players and team officials who will serve as community leaders in ending domestic violence and sexual assault.

Message from the Executive Director

On another front, PCADV continues to work diligently with local police departments to reduce the number of domestic violence-related homicides in the commonwealth. Ninety Pennsylvania police departments had implemented our Lethality Assessment Program by the end of 2014.

What is LAP? It's a screening tool that helps local police answering domestic. violence calls to quickly determine whether a victim is at high risk of being killed. Those determined to be in danger are encouraged to seek help immediately from

their local domestic violence program. "The Lethality Assessment Program has definitely been a success," said Tamara Hawthorne, a detective for the City of Pittsburgh, which implemented LAP in December 2013. "It is getting more victims of domestic violence in contact with victim services. It definitely has reduced the incidents. I'm seeing it firsthand."

PCADV continues to expand its philanthropic efforts in order to develop new revenue streams to support domestic violence programs and victims. We launched a Giving Circle last year in Western Pennsylvania to raise new funds for prevention programs. The Giving Circle brings together like-minded businesses and individuals who work collaboratively to identify and select specific programs they wish to financially support. The Western Pennsylvania Giving Circle has about two-dozen members and continues to grow.

As the nations oldest statewide domestic violence coalition, PCADV is proud of our members record for helping women and families in crisis. Each year together we provide quality services, including legal assistance, to more than 85,000 Pennsylvanians, and technical assistance to allied professionals. We could not do this without your help and support.
