Youth work opportunities

Summer Youth Program: Lackawanna County residents between 14 and 18 who meet income eligibility requirements will be paid \$12 an hour, up to 25 hours per week, to work on projects in their own communities.

Internship program: Students aged 18-24 can gain internship experience for \$12 an hour for 25 hours per week.

Summer Crew Work Leaders: Work leaders are paid \$23 an hour for 30 hours a week. Must have a high school diploma or the general equivalency.
